10. Nature of Defect:

The use of 'forward' and 'reverse' within the CertificatePair construct in crossCertificatePair attribute definition has been the source of great confusion. In a given CA's directory entry, the 'forward' component, if present, of a value of that attribute holds a certificate issued TO that CA and the 'reverse' component, if present, holds a certificate issued BY that CA to some other CA.

A certificate using system that is building a path of certificates using the information in that directory entry would make use of the certificate(s) stored in the 'forward' component if they are developing their path of certificates from the end-entity certificate toward a trust anchor and would make use of the 'reverse' component if they are developing their path of certificates from the trust anchor toward the end-entity certificate. Generally, these path development directions are described opposite to the directions of the component (i.e. a path developed in the reverse direction uses the forward component and a path developed in the forward direction uses the reverse component).

11. Solution Proposed by the Source:

In the asn.1 construct CertificatePair,

replace "forward" with "issuedByThisCA" and replace "reverse" with "issuedToThisCA" In the descriptive text, throughout X.509, update the text accordingly to reflect these new terms. This includes:

- general descriptive text in clause 8(1997), clause 7 (2000),
- asn.1 and descriptive text for the cross certificate pair attribute in clause 8 (1997) and clause 11.2.3 (2000),
- asn.1 and descriptive text for the associated matching rules in clause 12.7.3 and 12.7.4 (1997) and clauses 11.3.3 and 11.3.4 (2000) and
- the duplicate asn.1 constructs in Annex A.
